of Queen's College Ground situated on the south west quarter of lot number Twenty of Kingston laid down from actual Survey and exhibiting a correct delineation of the same. In the Survey of this tract I have laid down the East and West limits thereof as the boundaries, as the law directs the bounds of which is N. 4. 3. 10 W. The length of the road to the Road; the western limit, being the side line between lots. No 208, 21 also 211 is well authenticated, the monument at the S. E. angle of this tract is placed a conspicuous line as shown here from it to the original front corner 24. 20. in is also well established.

The above Description is a true Copy of the Plan of Queen's College Ground, Surveyed by the Trustees, to wit: 7th August 1841.

Sketch of Queen College Ground situated on the south West Quarter of Lot No. 21 first concession of the Township of Kingston. Showing the plot Village lots about to be laid out on that part of the tract lying north of the continuation of Union Street in Lots of two acres each excepting those fronting on that Street which contain from about one acre and fifteen Rods, each to one acre and a quarter, and Number 3 on each side of College Street which are one acre each.
