The Chateau Laurier is the rendezvous of the world-traveller, statesman, ambassador and tourist. In every detail of its accommodations for a thousand guests, it has been designed to appeal to the most discriminating and to create an unforgettable impression of combined beauty, dignity and hospitality.

Every room is a modern masterpiece of its type. The spacious rotunda exemplifies the best in Elizabethan influence, the lovely colonnades and galleries being for the most part mid-Georgian. The main dining-room is an exquisite creation of purest Adam period in soft tones of green. The ballroom is a dream of enchantment. The Jasper tea room intrigues and fascinates with its gay, colorful, fantastic totem-poles, its striking mural decorations, Indian symbols, and its fountain, miniature of a roaring cataract falling into a sparkling lake. In the personal service to guests—in its excellent cuisine—its entertainment features—its comfort and accommodations for the individual or convention party, the Chateau Laurier is unquestionably the *dernier mot* in hotels.

About Ottawa

One of the most beautiful cities in Canada, founded in 1862, Ottawa is everything that the Dominion Capital should be. It has an ideal setting on a picturesque promontory on the south shore of the Ottawa River, at the confluence of the Rideau and Gatineau Rivers.

Among the chief points of interest in the city are the Houses of Parliament, Rideau Hall—the home of Canada's Governor-General, the Public Archives, the Royal Mint, the National Art Gallery and Victoria Memorial Museum, the Dominion Observatory and the Central Experimental Farm. Over thirty-five miles of garden-bordered driveways wind through the city, and 27 lovely parks and squares enhance its beauty.

Excellent Motor Roads Lead to Ottawa

From the South: Ontario Provincial Highways—No. 16 from Prescott, No. 31 from Morrisburg, and No. 15 from Kingston.

From Montreal and the East: Ontario Provincial Highway No. 17 or Quebec Highways Nos. 8 and 11.

From North Bay and other western points: Ontario Provincial Highway No. 17.

See the Dionne Quintuplets — The shortest route to Callander from Montreal and eastern points is over Ontario Provincial Highway No. 17, via Ottawa.
