GRACEFULLY linking rail and ocean traffic, The Nova Scotian at Halifax, N.S., has an individuality all its own. Its architecture, a free adaptation of the Georgian style, was suggested by the historical associations of Halifax and by many of the older buildings in the city; the design is in

most pleasing harmony with the Halifax of today and the Halifax that is passed.

Few hotels anywhere are afforded the setting of the Nova Scotian. To the West, facing the main entrance, is a formal park. Adjoining the hotel to the North and East (the harbour front) is a garden terrace. On a lower level, and between the terrace and Marginal Road which parallels the docks, is a rose garden broken by attractive walks. From the terraced roof gardens, leading off the eighth floor, the view commands the entire country about Halifax.

All in all, this splendidly furnished hotel with its 170 guests rooms, all of which have private tub and shower bath, will charm the most exacting patron who desires the highest standard of service, accommodation and cuisine.

No Taxi Nor Baggage Charges

The map on the back of this folder will give motorists a general idea of the most direct route to the Nova Scotian upon entering the city. Arriving on either Route 1 or 2, you come to the North West Arm, one of Halifax's beauty spots and the site for many boating and swimming clubs. Proceed along Quinpool Road and Bell Road to the Public Gardens. At this point, turn left down Spring Garden Road to Barrington Street and then turn right and proceed three blocks to South Street, where the Nova Scotian will be seen on your left.

Halifax

Halifax is historical ground. Almost two hundred years ago, the first attempt at settlement on the present site of Halifax was made. The British Government determined to build a permanent establishment in Acadia and decided on Chebucto Bay because of the magnificent harbour, and the contour of the land afforded splendid opportunity for fortification to protect the settlement from the constant raids at that time. The old Indian name of Chebucto was changed to Halifax in honour of Lord Halifax.

Among the chief points of interest in the city are Government House, Dalhousie University, the famous Citadel, the Ocean Terminals and Dry Dock, beautiful Point Pleasant Park, and the North West Arm. Within easy driving distance of the city, there are numerous beauty spots—quaint fishing villages, such as Peggy's Cove, and the summer resorts, Hubbard and Chester.
